# Advantages vs disadvantages of a placement

#### **Advantages**

- You will gain valuable work experience and skills
- You will become better organised and are likely to get a better degree
- You may be offered a job after you graduate
- You will be paid!
- Overall a good placement can put your future career on a completely different track

#### **Disadvantages**

- It is hard work making applications
- This happens during your second year
- Poor A-levels & first year results
- Even with good results, rejection can happen often and it is very upsetting
- You need to be prepared to deal with this
- You come back to University when many of your friends have graduated

## How to get a placement?

- Step 1
  - Think about what firms you might wish to work for
    - —e.g. Government departments, Morgan Stanley, VW, IBM, Microsoft, Disney, etc.
  - Find out whether they offer placements
    - -This allows you to background research on them
- Step 2:
  - Dedicated search engines
    - -Target Connect <a href="https://careers.kent.ac.uk/home.html">https://careers.kent.ac.uk/home.html</a>
    - –Aspirations https://blogs.kent.ac.uk/aspirations
    - -Rate my placement <a href="http://www.ratemyplacement.co.uk/">http://www.ratemyplacement.co.uk/</a>
    - -Indeed.co.uk <u>http://www.indeed.co.uk/</u>

#### How to get a placement?

- Step 3
  - Prepare and plan over the summer
  - Arrive in September ready to start applications
  - Government Economic Service (GES) and Bank of England (early session)
    - Application window is very early and very narrow
    - -If this is what you are interested, you need to be ready by September
- Step 4
  - Work hard!

## What you have to do this summer?

- Think about whether you want to do a placement or not
  - Are you prepared to commit the time/effort?
  - What type of placement you want?
  - What firms you would like a placement with?
- Summer internship, summer job, volunteer, etc.
- Write out your CV

## What happens next year?

- Next year you will be enrolled in a non-contributory module: ECON5360 - Preparing for a placement
- Moodle space for documents, a mailing list, KV timetabled events, etc.
- Core support provided:
  - Improving your CV
  - Assistance with the application process
