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Career planner – January

Other Schemes

British Council's Generation UK China Scheme

Students in receipt of a maintenance grant and attaining a 2:1 or higher have the opportunity to be funded by the British Council to undertake a 2 month internship in Beijing, Shanghai or Shenzhen with CRCC Asia. Funding will cover the students' internship provision, insurance, accommodation, Mandarin lessons and the many social, cultural and business events laid on by CRCC Asia throughout their time in China. They will also receive 24 hour support from the CRCC Asia team in their host city. CRCC Asia have been an official provider of Generation UK China since its launch in 2013 and aim to help the British Council and Universities across the UK send thousands more students overseas for study abroad and internship programs. The idea is to assist young people who wish to give service to an overseas community in need of help, either in a gap year or after further education. We expect the individual to offer themselves through a nationally registered charity and to live in the Canterbury area.


Drop-ins & Appointments at the Careers & Employability Service
