
### **Morning Session**

Our morning session will be in **Canterbury Cathedral Archives & Library**, where doors will open at 10:30am.

To locate the Archives & Library, you may find this old map useful:



What this does not show is that the entrance to the Cathedral precincts is in the south-west corner. If the gate is open, go through it and explain to the person on the desk that you are attending an event in the Archives. Walk past the West Front, and where there is the sign for the Old Palace, turn right towards and into the Cloisters. Walk around to the east side, past the Chapter House, and in the corridor just after that, the entrance to the Archives is the first door on the left.

There will be someone on hand to guide you if you are lost. Please note that attendance at this event does not permit free access to the cathedral itself.

Be warned: you may encounter Morris Dancers on your way across the precincts (there is the annual Hop Hoodening Service at 11am).

There will be a small display of manuscripts and medieval documents especially arranged for us from 10:30am. Because of this, there will be **no refreshments** in the Archives for this morning session, so do arrive suitably caffeinated! There are plenty of cafés immediately outside the Cathedral Gate.

We are delighted that Prof. Nicholas Vincent has agreed to speak to us at 11am. We expect to leave the Cathedral between noon and 12:15pm, and will then be making our way up to the campus of the University of Kent.

### From Cathedral to Campus

The forecast is for a bright, if autumnal, day and some of us will prefer to walk up the hill. It is a pleasant route and will take between 30 and 45 minutes. We will guide you up there.

If, though, you prefer to travel by vehicle, the Bus Station is a 5 minute walk from the Cathedral precincts:
