Ambition to Succeed

Our flagship level 3 progression scheme

Each year we invite applications from year 12 and first year FE level 3 students to join our exciting progression scheme. Priority is given to applicants who meet one or more of the eligibility criteria.


The programme comprises both online and in person sessions, culminating in a residential stay on our Canterbury campus. Students participate in engaging and interactive activities, incorporating information, exploration and experience. Midway through year one, students choose a subject strand, reflecting their emerging subject preferences.

We continue to offer guidance to students in year 13/FE level 3 year two, providing key information and support around choices, applications and transition to HE.

Students who successfully complete the programme and secure a place at the University of Kent, will be eligible for our Ambition to Succeed Scholarship.


Careers and employability
