Are you considering applying to university?

Do you want to study locally and are you interested in courses available at Kent?

If you answered yes, then Ambition to Succeed could be right for you! This free programme, delivered by our friendly team of staff and student ambassadors, is designed to help young people from Kent and Medway explore both the academic and social side of university life. You will be encouraged to analyse your own interests, strengths and ambitions, and you will have the opportunity to gain in-depth experience of Kent subjects that interest you.

What does the programme entail?

The course in Year 12/FE L3 Year 1 involves a programme of online sessions and campus visits, from March to July. These activities take you through the key stages of university life and will help you decide what you might want from your own university experience. You will be supported to build your confidence and knowledge around higher education, enhance your communication and academic skills, and develop a clear understanding of the subject(s) you want to apply for.

As part of your application, you will choose a subject area that you would like to focus on and learn more about.

These might include but are not limited to: Law, Psychology, Sociology, Criminology, Architecture, Drama, Film, Media, Graphic Design, English, History, Digital Design, Business, Economics, Politics, International Relations, Computing, Engineering, Forensic Science, Conservation. Please note, a variety of subject content will be accessible to students on the programme. However, we cannot guarantee all subjects will be available.

In July, we will invite you for an immersive residential experience on our Canterbury campus, to build knowledge, friendships and memories!

Year 13/FE L3 Year 2 support

In Year 13/Year 2, we will continue to support your application journey, with a series of online drop-in and group support sessions at key points in the application cycle. We will be there to help you all the way through your journey to university.

Ambition to Succeed Scholarship and Scholars Programme

On successful completion of the programme and if you are accepted on to a course at Kent, you will be eligible for our Ambition to Succeed scholarship package. Terms apply, see our website for more information.

Who can apply?

We encourage all interested Year 12 or FE L3 Year 1 students to apply. In addition to having achieved five GCSEs 9-4, including Maths and English, priority is given to those who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Your parent(s)/guardians(s) did not attend university
- You have been in receipt of Free School Meals
- You live in an area with lower than expected participation in Higher Education
- You are from a group which is underrepresented in Higher Education including:
 - Live in or have lived in local authority care
 - Refugees or unaccompanied asylum seeking children
 - Disabled students
 - Young Carers
 - Those studying without the support of family/carers
 - Gypsy, Traveller, Roma, showmen and boater
 - Child of a Military family
