


Make a real contribution to conservation whilst working side-by-side with stunning African Wildlife

The UmPhafa Private Nature Reserve was established by Colchester Zoo's charity, Action for the Wild, in 2004 with the intention of creating a 4500ha conservation area exclusively for the research of African flora and fauna, and as a centre for environmental education. Following extensive measures to rehabilitate the habitat and recreate much of the region's former species assemblage, UmPhafa is now home to a wide range of mammalian species including white rhino, giraffe, leopard, spotted hyena and zebra, as well as an array of smaller carnivores and antelope species.
