The Employability Points Scheme







What is the EP Scheme?



The EP Scheme bridges the gap between education and employment.

Students are allocated 'Employability Points' for taking part in extracurricular activities and these can be 'cashed-in' for rewards which include internships, project placements, work experience, training and vouchers.




Why get involved?




2. Claim Employability Points
