


PHILOSOPHY AT KENT DAY

- **Teaching excellence:** The University of Kent has been awarded a gold rating, the highest, in the UK Government's Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF).
- **Flexibility:** You can choose from a broad range of topics in both the analytic and continental traditions to shape your degree in line with your interests.

Our staff have written on key philosophical topics, with recent publications including Edward Kanterian's *Kant, God and Metaphysics: The Secret Thorn* (Routledge, 2018) and Simon Kirchin's *Thick Evaluation* (Oxford University Press, 2017) and *Metaethics* (Macmillan, 2012), as well as our in-house bulletin *The Reasoner*, edited by Jon Williamson.
- **Study abroad:** We offer all our students the opportunity to spend a year or term abroad as part of their degree. We have exchange programmes all over the world with top-ranked institutions.
- **Superb student experience:** Our green and spacious campus overlooks the historic city of Canterbury. As well as state-of-the-art academic facilities like the Templeman Library, the campus has plenty of bars, eateries, an independent cinema and theatre, sports centre and nightclub.
- **Employment prospects:** We take employability seriously, and make sure that our students graduate with a range of skills that give them the edge in finding work after university. We run an employability programme each year especially for our students.
- **Supportive student community:** Kent is committed to ensuring that you make the best out of your time here.
